LONDON HOUSING TARGETS AND DELIVERY 2016/17

(from data provided in the September 2018 Annual Monitoring Report of the London Plan)

SUMMARY

2016/17 London housing targets

- 42248 total number of homes
- 17,000 'affordable homes'
- 10,200 social or 'affordable' rent homes (60% of 'affordable' homes target).
- 6,800 intermediate homes (40% of affordable homes target)

2016/17 London housing delivery

- 45,505 delivered across London (**107%** of target)
- 7,347 'affordable' homes (43% of target and 16% of all homes delivered)
- 2,318 social-rented homes (**5%** of all homes delivered in London)
- 2,103 'affordable' rent homes (5% of all homes delivered in London)
- 4,421 combined social and 'affordable' rent homes (43% of the target and 10% of total homes delivered)
- 2,926 intermediate homes (43% of target and 6% of all homes delivered).
- 38,158 market homes (**150%** of target and **84%** of all homes delivered)

Housing delivery is not meeting Londoner's needs, with its massive under-delivery of social-rented and over delivery of market homes.

NB despite the London Plan setting a target for all types of homes, when looking at percentages of homes delivered, the Mayor's office only looks at percentages of the conventional self-contained homes delivered (excluding non self-contained homes (student, care-homes and shared / HMOs) in the Annual Monitoring Report of the London Plan.

In this document we look at percentages of the total delivery.

LONDON HOUSING TARGETS AND DELIVERY - 2016/17

LONDON HOUSING TARGETS

Targets are set out in the London Mayor's London Plan. The Plan contains a London-wide net (additional homes taking into account any lost through demolition) target and net targets for each borough and (in the current Plan) for the London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC) area .

The current London Plan's London-wide target is for 42,248 additional homes per annum. It also sets an annual net target for 17,000 'affordable' homes, of which 60% (10,200) should be social or 'affordable' rent homes and 40% (6,800) intermediate. In total 24% of the full hous-



ing target is for social and 'affordable' rent homes, 16% intermediate and 60% market homes.

A higher annual target of 64,935 is contained in the draft new London Plan. The final target won't be formally agreed until sometime in 2019. The draft also proposes a strategic target of 50% affordable housing; amounting to 32,468 affordable homes a year.

It is proposed that this affordable target will comprise targets of 30% low-cost rented homes (15% of all homes), 30% immediate homes (15% of all homes) and 40% (20% of all homes) that are to be determined by the boroughs / local planning authorities.



HOUSING DELIVERY

The Mayor's most recent, September 2018, Annual Monitoring Report (AMR) of the London Plan reports on housing delivery for 2016/17. A total of **45,505** homes were delivered (107% of target). While this sounds good, it is misleading as many of these homes don't meet Londoners' needs.

The total includes **41,371** conventional self-contained homes, **4,526** non self-contained homes, and **392** more long-term empty properties than there were last year, resulting in a minus 392 figure on the total homes delivered. Government data on long term empty homes relates to homes that have (discretionary) council tax discounts, so can't be treated as absolute. This data shows that there were 349 less combined council and housing association long-term vacant homes, which might would imply an additional 349 net social/affordable rent homes to the affordable homes delivered (see total below) and 741 less net market homes.

Additional homes include: newly built homes, converted homes and homes delivered through change of use. The net non self-contained homes delivered in 2016/17 comprised: 4,391 student, 192 care home and -57 and hostels or HMO bed-spaces.

The table (right) sets out the current London Plan borough and LLDC targets, totals and the percentage of targets delivered. The LLDC and 13 boroughs failed to meet their targets. Sutton delivered more than double its target. Bexley, Brent, Bromley, Camden, Croydon and Wandsworth delivered more than 150% of their targets.

Affordable homes delivered: 7,347 (just 16% of the total homes delivered). This comprises 2,318 social-rented homes; 2,103 'affordable' rent homes (each being 5% of all homes delivered) and 2,926 intermediate homes (6% of all homes delivered) We must be sceptical about what is recorded in the AMR as social-rented homes. Many boroughs record the previous Mayor's 'capped affordable rent' and Sadiq Khan's 'London Affordable Rent' homes as social rented; acknowledged in the AMR.

Market homes delivered: calculated as (total homes delivered) minus (affordable homes delivered) was 38,158. This is 150% of the target and 84% of all homes delivered.

Delivery compared to housing need: The Mayor's latest assessment of housing need shows that if both newly arising need and backlog of need were to be met <u>in a 25 year period, 30,972 new low-cost (social-rented) homes</u> would have to be delivered each year. If need were met over a more reasonable <u>10-year period</u> (as previously required), the target for low cost/social-rented homes would have to increase to almost 41,000 per annum.

The table (left) sets out borough and LLDC targets for market homes - (total target) minus (proportionate affordable homes target), the number of market homes delivered and the percentage of all homes delivered that were market homes.

In all but Barking & Dagenham, Enfield and Waltham Forest more than 75% of homes delivered were market homes. 90% or more of all the homes delivered in Brent, Bromley Camden, City of London, Harrow, Islington, Kingston, K&C, Richmond, Sutton and Westminster & LLDC, were market homes.

Table (left below) sets out borough and LLDC targets for intermediate homes, the number of intermediate homes delivered and the percentage of all homes delivered that were intermediate homes.

Table (right below) sets out social & 'affordable' rent targets for each borough and the LLDC, separate and combined numbers of social & 'affordable' rent homes delivered and the % of all homes delivered that were social/affordable rent. In Bromley, H&F, Havering, Hillingdon, Merton, Sutton and Wandsworth, 5% or less of homes delivered were social/ 'affordable' rent. No social/ 'affordable' rent homes were delivered in City of London or Harrow.

NB we don't have separate 'affordable' housing delivery info for the LLDC area and assume these are recorded under relevant boroughs.
