The London Assembly

The London Assembly works for Londoners by holding the Mayor and the Mayoral advisers to account.

It publicly examines policies and programmes on vital issues such as crime, housing, transport and the economy.

The 25 members of the Assembly are chosen by Londoners in elections every four years.

The members of the Assembly make sure the Mayor and his or her advisers are doing the best job for London, every single day.

The Assembly can amend or approve the Mayor's budget, they scrutinise key projects and policies and can reject some Mayoral strategies. They also offer their support by providing recommendations and proposals on new ideas to improve life in the capital.
